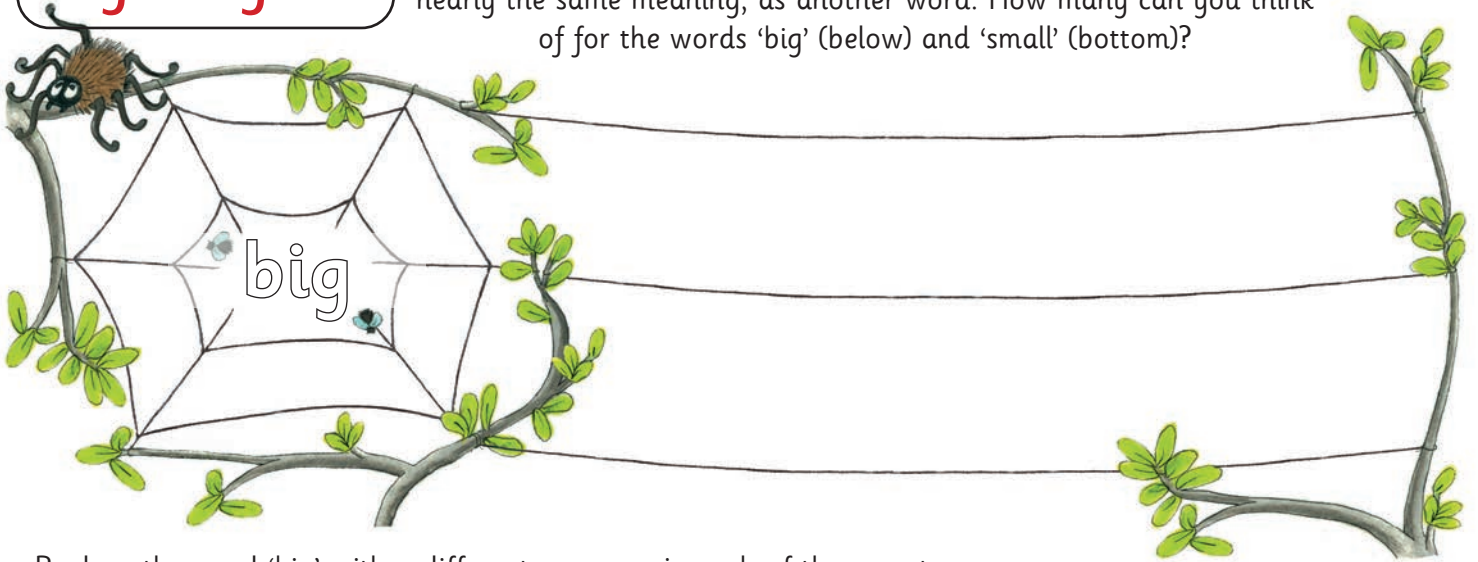


Synonyms

Replace the word 'big' with a different synonym in each of these sentences.

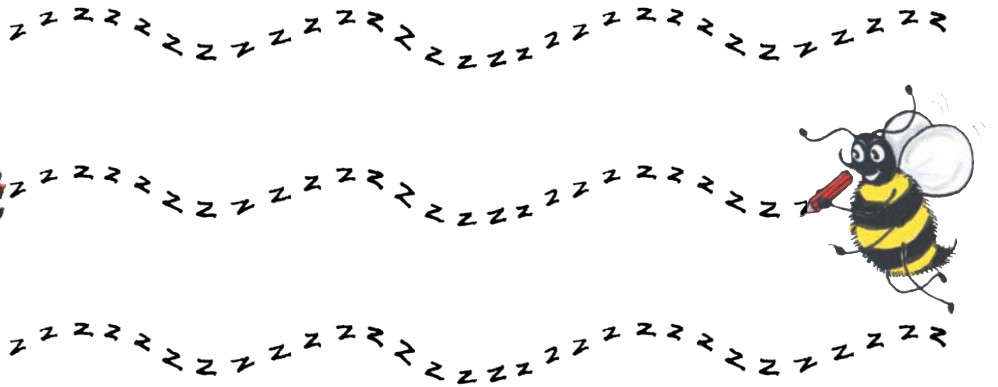
I saw a **big** spider.

The clothes they had bought for her were too **small**.

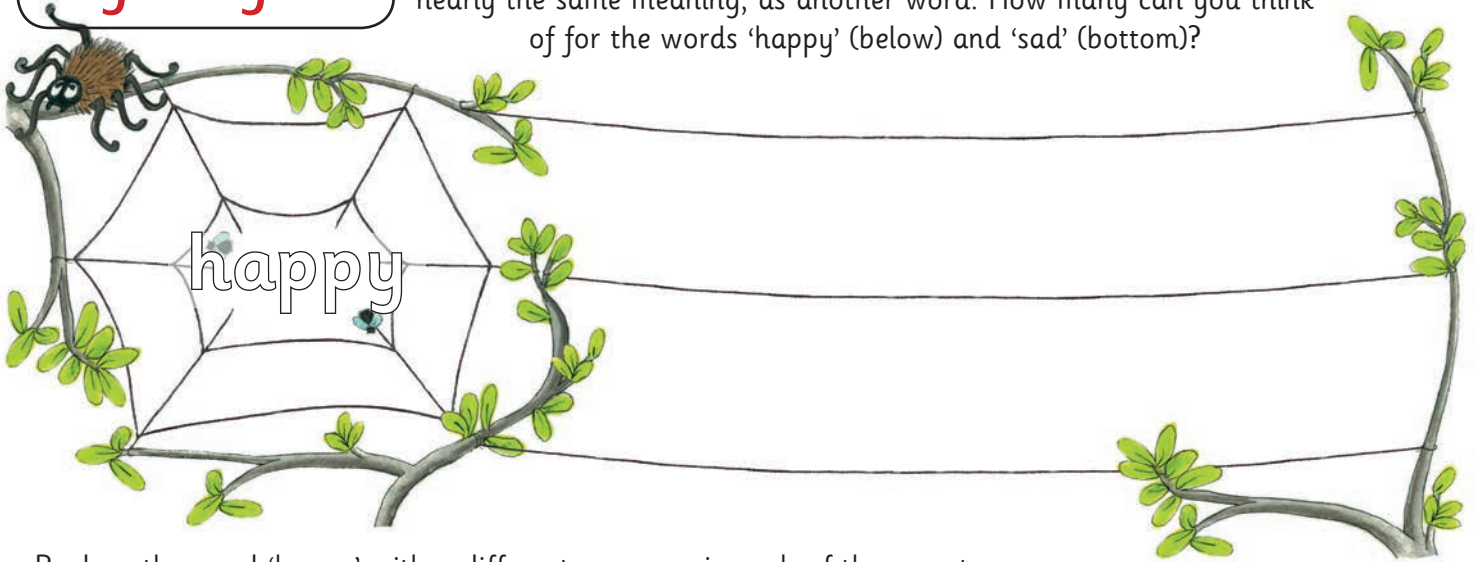


She was given a **small** slice of pie.

Replace the word 'happy' with a different synonym in each of these sentences.

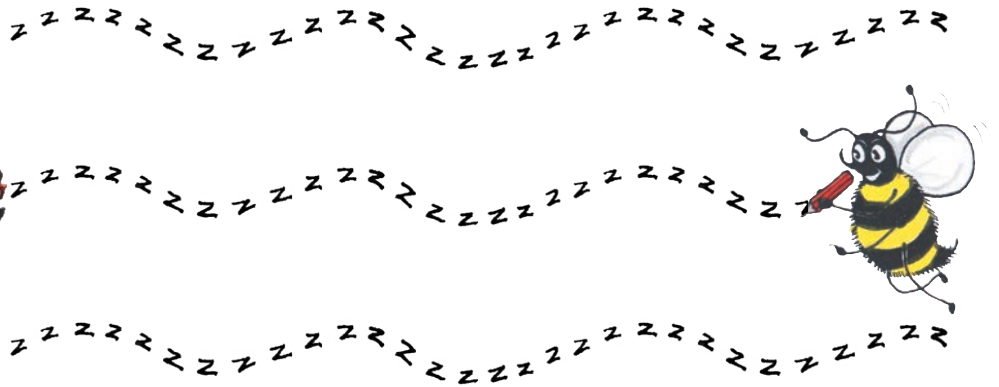
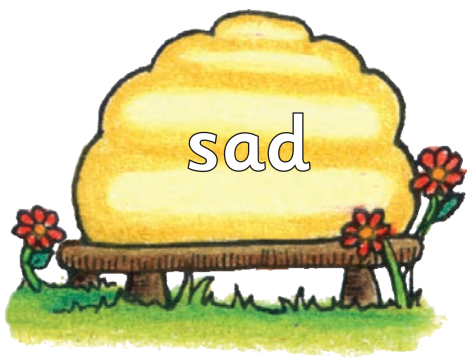
The film had a **happy** ending.

The lady seemed **sad** that the weekend was over.

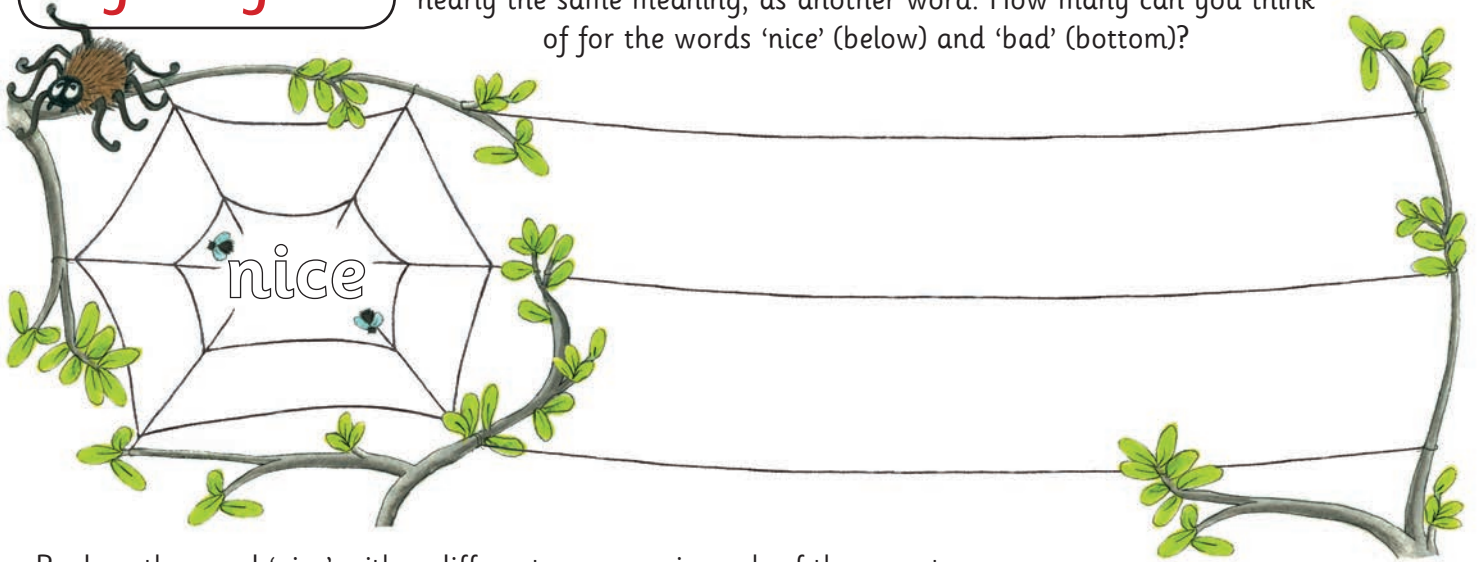


Saying goodbye to her class made the teacher **sad**.

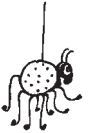

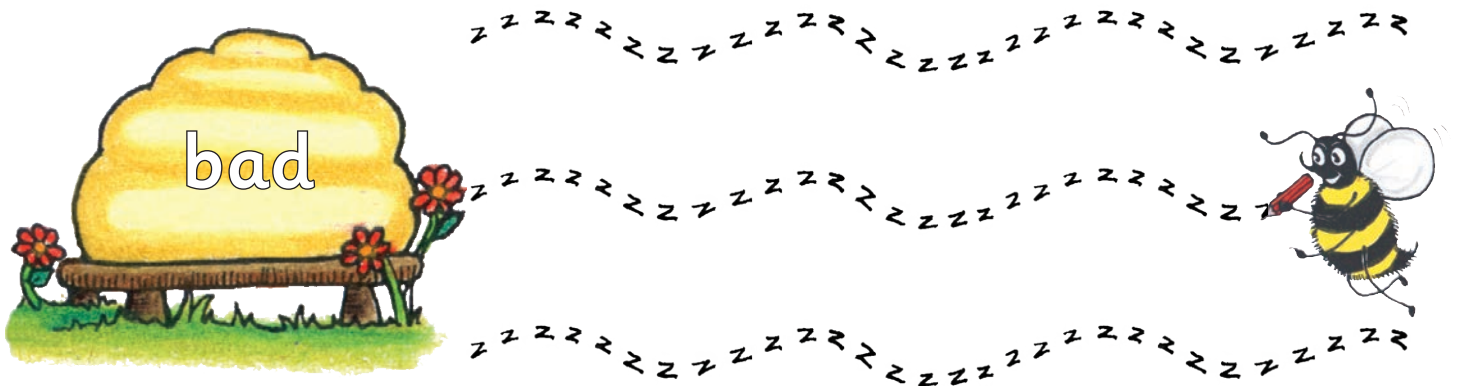

She read some **bad** news in the paper.

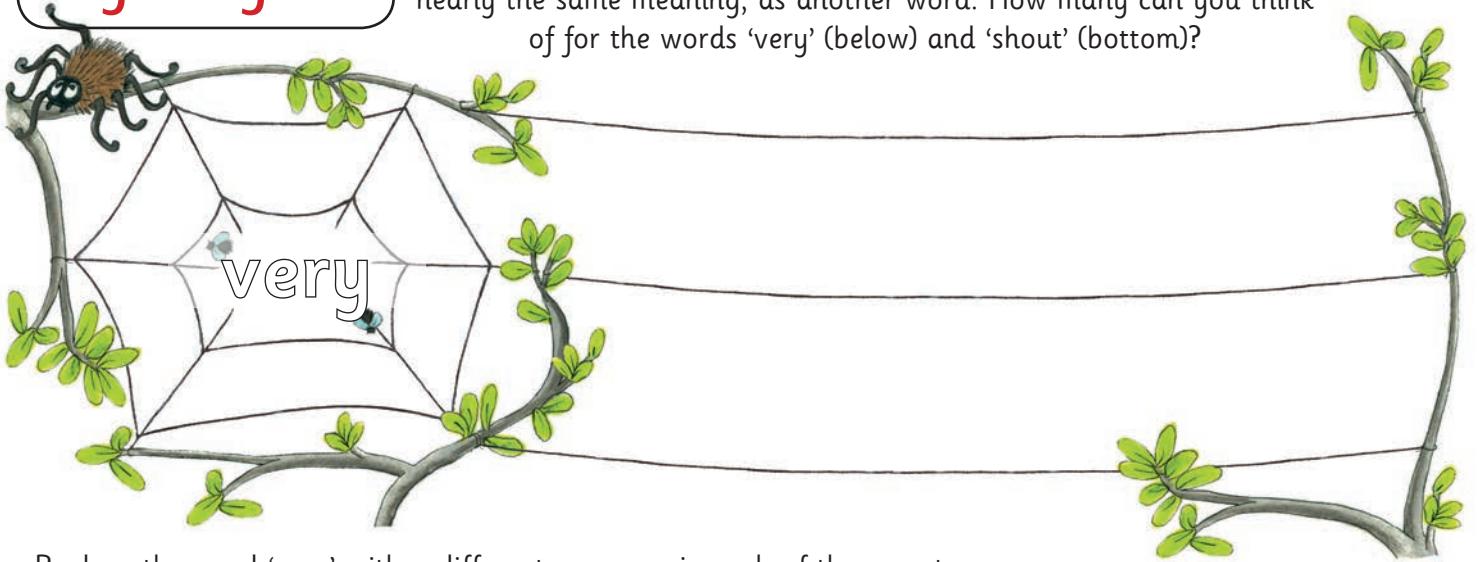

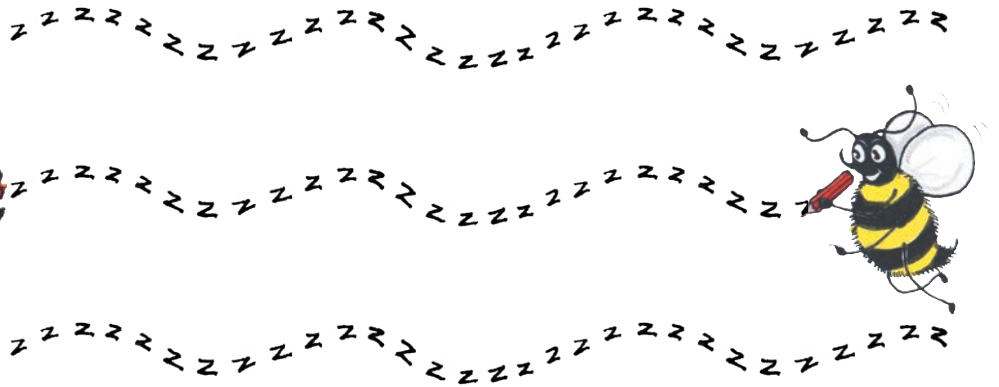
The school was **very** big.
